- **Web Liaison:** The duties of the Web Liaison is to coordinate items to be posted on the website with the web maser including posting of annual event forms, web advertising, web calendar, and changes to WMTA Board, bylaws and rules and to manage website hosting and domain name issues. • **Newsletter Editor:** The duties of the Newsletter Editor are to collect articles and photos from members for inclusion in the Newsletter, to coordinate advertising from outside groups and to format and distribute the newsletter, approximately three times per year. Simone Deering

Simone Deering passed away on Thursday, November 7, 2013. Simone was a longtime member of WMTA and served on the Board of Directors. She will be missed.

Nan Hillman

Nan Hillman, longtime piano teacher in Montgomery County, Md. passed away peacefully and with family present Thursday February 27. Her final days were blessed by the compassionate care of Casey House Hospice.

She will be remembered passionately by her loving husband Erik Hillman who shared her long love of classical music, especially the piano for their 43 years together.

Claire Nanette Baker Hillman was born in Moscow, Pa. in 1933. She held degrees from Peabody Institute in Baltimore and the University of Maryland. In the 1960s she was active in the desegregation of the Tivoli Theatre in Frederick, Md. and other venues and volunteered teaching the children of seasonal migrant workers. Nan loved the ocean at Bethany Beach, De. in earlier years and most recently enjoyed staying at Dunes Manor in Ocean City, Md. often.

Nan was very active with the Washington Music Teachers Association (WMTA). Over the years she served as a monitor and also chaired piano performance competitions including the Hartman Piano Awards in 1994-1995 and the Raissa Tselentis Bach Competition in 2009-2011. Well regarded by her peers, she was known to always have a smile and be energetic in the support of her talented students. She will be remembered especially by those students who she sat beside for 50 plus years developing and nurturing their love of music and the piano.

2nd place - \$200: Nathan Mo (Conway) Honorable Mention: Kevin Mo (Gramaticova)


SENIOR DIVISION: 1st place - \$600 and performance with the Capital City Symphony
