- 2. AND a different Sinfonia of the contestant's choice.

#### Senior Division (age 20 or under):

- 1. Choose one of these Preludes and Fugues from the Well-Tempered Clavier, Volume I: No. 4 in C-sharp minor, No. 10 in e minor or No. 21 in B-flat Major.
- 2. AND a Prelude and Fugue of the contestant's choice from the Well-Tempered Clavier, Volume II.
